From bindweed, to blights, to the ubiquitous squash bugs, growing in the Midwest can be challenging. This workshop will cover preventative and control measures, focusing on those appropriate for organic production.

Ray Cloyd, K-State Entomologist, will help us identify area pests and learn about organic control options including exclusion methods, IPM, OMRI approved pesticides and more.

1:15 – 2:30 Plant Diseases

Megan Kennelly, K-State Plant Pathologist, will review common plant disease and control measures. She'll also share info on how to have university labs help you with disease identification.

2:45 - 4:00 Farm tour, East Wind Gardens

East Wind grows certified organic vegetables and flowers, and sells at an on-site stand, a farmers market and to area restaurants. They have a heated greenhouse and a high tunnel.
